# 1.2. Academic Unit Involved in the Delivery of the Programme

The Minor Programme is to be offered by the Globalisation and Development Programme (GAD) and administered under the Division of Humanities and Social Sciences (DHSS).

### 1.3. Programme Aims, Objectives, and Intended Learning Outcomes

The general aim of the Minor Programme is to familiarize students with important global drivers and trends, such as the rise of the Global South, the intensification of multilateral integration and cooperation mechanisms, as well as the emergence of global and regional governance agendas on development, sustainability and social inclusion. The objective is therefore to train students to make sense of global affairs' complexity, and nurture their ability to ultimately cooperate effectively, upon graduation, as responsible global actors on behalf of private corporations, international organisations, academic institutions and public management agencies.

### 2. Programme Requirements and Structure

### 2.1. Programme Requirements

Students can claim the Globalisation and Sustainable Development Minor Programme if they can fulfil the following criteria:

- a) Complete 15 units (5 courses) in accordance with the stipulated programme structure below;
- b) Attain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for all the courses.

# 2.2. Programme Structure

Inspired by principles of flexibility and interdisciplinarity, the seekers of Minor Programme in Globalisation and Sustainable Development shall complete 5 courses chosen freely among the following 13 courses (11 of which are Major Required courses offered regularly by the GAD Major Programme to its own major students over their Year 2-Year 4 study plan, while 2 are Major Required courses offered regularly by the Environmental Science Programme of the Division of Science and Technology<sup>©</sup>):

Students are required to complete at least one course at level 3 or above.
